Parents: George and Annie m Family: 1 sister, 5 brothers all in Navy, Edwin, Harry, Willie, George, Frank Children : Eileen Rose Address pre 1914: given as Solent View, Yarmouth Address post 1914: Alma Place, then South Street, Yarmouth.

Charlie on right wearing medals, Rose wearing Red Cross Nurse's uniform

Job pre 1914: Royal Navy Signaller Job post 1914: Left Navy 1923

Worked for Robert May (father-in-law) carpenter, coffin maker in Ommanney Road, Yarmouth.

Signalman on Yarmouth's first Lifeboat B.A.S.P. for 23 years.

Royal Navy. Official Number: 230772 served on **H.M.S. Magpie** stationed off Yarmouth 1916 Enlisted 1904 aged 12 or 14 as Stoker Boy, became Signaller, medal for service in Persian Gulf 1909 -14, served at Battle of Jutland on H.M.S. Iron Duke.

H.M.S. Magpie in WW1 was a torpedo gunboat of Redbreast Class. Launched in 1889, became a defence vessel in 1902, then a depot ship in October 1915





Charlie was Signaller and taught Rose semaphore so that they could exchange messages from ship to town. This was especially useful if the Naval police were on their way, looking for illicit tobacco and alcohol. Rose's parents' dining table had a hollow leg for hiding contraband!
